LOS SEMBRADORES FARMER TRAINING:

THE PROGRAM IS BASED ON A MODEL OF CULTIVATING LEADERSHIP SKILLS ALONGSIDE FARMING SKILLS AND PASSING ON TRADITIONAL KNOWLEDGE. IN 2022, THE NMAA HOSTED ITS SIXTH YEAR OF OUR FARMER TRAINING PROGRAM. THROUGH THE PROGRAM, NMAA PROVIDES WORKSHOPS, APPRENTICESHIPS, AND FARM BUSINESS PLANNING.

TRAINING AND WORKSHOPS ARE BASED ON SEASONAL TOPICS AND SKILLS RELEVANT TO SMALL- SCALE AGRICULTURE, IRRIGATION, AND INDIGENOUS FOOD TRADITIONS.

--APPRENTICESHIPS: NMAA ENGAGED FARM APPRENTICES OVER THE COURSE OF 10 MONTHS THROUGH A GROWING SEASON. THEY LEARNED ONSITE TWO DAYS A WEEK AND WORKED ONE DAY AT THEIR HOME GARDEN PROJECT, WHERE THEY IMPLEMENTED THE SKILLS THEY LEARNED AT THE DEMONSTRATION SITE. #### YOUTH EDUCATION:

IN 2022, NMAA EXPANDED THE REACH OF OUR YOUTH EDUCATION WORK. WE BROADENED THE NETWORK OF STATEWIDE K-12 ADMINISTRATORS AND EDUCATORS THAT WE PARTNER WITH, AND ALSO OF CONTINUED CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT EFFORTS. WE HAVE WITNESSED OUR SCHOOL AND YOUTH PRESENTATIONS HELP NEW MEXICO YOUTH DEEPEN THEIR UNDERSTANDING OF NEW MEXICO'S UNIQUE ACEQUIAS SYSTEMS, CONNECT WITH THE AGRICULTURAL HISTORY IN THEIR FAMILIES AND COMMUNITIES, AND FEEL EMPOWERED TO DEVELOP PLACE-BASED SOLUTIONS AND VISIONS FOR THE FUTURE OF FARMING AND RANCHING IN THEIR HOMEPLACES. WE WORKED ON THREE PROJECTS: (1) THE SEMBRANDO SEMILLAS LAND-BASED INTERGENERATIONAL LEARNING PROGRAM, (2) THE ACEQUIA CULTURE YOUTH LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE, (3) THE ACEQUIA CAREER AND LIFEWAYS PROGRAM, AND (4) OUR EXTENSIVE SCHOOL AND YOUTH PRESENTATION INITIATIVE.

--SEMBRANDO SEMILLAS: THIS PROGRAM REACHES CHILDREN AND TEENS AGES 2-18 AT LEARNING SITES IN CHAMISAL, TAOS, ABIQUIU AND CHIMAYO. EACH 'SEM SEM' SITE CONSISTS OF A LOCAL FAMILY FARM AND EXPERIENCED MENTOR WHO LEADS WORKSHOPS AND EVENTS THROUGHOUT THE GROWING SEASON TO HELP THEIR COHORT OF YOUTH CONNECT WITH THEIR CULTURAL HERITAGE THROUGH HANDS-ON ACEQUIA WORK; FARMING, GARDENING AND RANCHING; AND FOOD PREPARATION AND PRESERVATION.
