BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

SB 472 would expand the information required to be posted on the sunshine portal.

Section 1 would add the definition of financial information, sunshine portal, and transparency website.

Section 2 would allow only the New Mexico Department of Information to act as the operator of the sunshine portal. This section also reorganizes the format for the current statute and includes new material regarding the financial information to be disclosed, including: budget adjustments, quarterly consensus revenue estimates, reversions and cash balances, annual summary, appropriations. This section further exempts information regarding certain employee's personal identifying information.

Section 4 states that no agency is required to post information which the agency head has made a written determination that prevailing public interest is against publishing that type of information on the internet.

The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 2017

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

This proposed bill mainly cleans up the formatting of the current statute. However, the New Mexico Department of Information should ensure that they do not post information that is otherwise protected by New Mexico state of federal statute, rule, or Constitution
