BILL SUMMARY

<u>Synopsis:</u> HB 118 is a bill that creates an Office of Entrepreneurship within the Economic Development Division of the Economic Development Department, with the aim of strengthening policies and the growth of entrepreneurship throughout New Mexico by working with organizations supporting entrepreneurship, providing technical support for entrepreneurs, and providing assistance with their interactions with state government. Achievement of those stated goals would be through the preparation of a report regarding whether legislation supports, hinders or otherwise affects entrepreneurship and creating an appropriation of \$500,000 to fund the Office of Entrepreneurship.
